their team, Ryan Palkowsky, Sr. Project Manager and Eric Peterson, NYC Dept.of Parks.



ALL Queens residents have Curbside Composting service.* No sign-up needed.

Curbside Composting was suspended during the winter

Service will resume the week of March 27, 2023.

Who Can Compost

ALL Queens residents can participate in Curbside Composting. All residential buildings – single-and multi-family homes and apartment buildings of all sizes – now receive weekly Curbside Composting collection. Your compost collection day is the same as your recycling day. Find your collection schedule.

How to Compost

Set out your compost at the curb in a labeled bin with a secure lid or in your DSNY brown compost bin (extra leaf and yard waste can be put in a bag separate from trash.)

Learn more about composting in larger buildings. Order a free composting bin decal at nyc.gov/CompostingBinDecal. NOTE: Bins must be 55 gallons or less. You can use a plastic liner to help keep your bin clean.

What to Compost

We will pick up ALL leaf and yard waste, food scraps, and food-soiled paper. This includes meat, bones, dairy, prepared foods, and greasy uncoated paper plates and pizza boxes.

What Not to Compost

Do not compost trash such as diapers, personal hygiene products, animal waste, wrappers, non-paper packaging, and foam products.

Do not compost recyclable materials. Learn more about what you can recycle.
